Defense Offset Policy Guidelines

Background

Public procurement of the National Government of the Argentine Republic is regulated through the Decree N° 1023/2001 and its specific regulation through the Decree N° 1030/2016.

In 2018, Argentina updated its "Buy Local" policy for National Government procurement through the Law N° 27.437/2018. This Law introduced the so-called "Productive Cooperation Agreements", or "offsets".

Major provisions of this Law are the following:

- The Law applies to the National Government and the State Owned Companies, but only for acquisitions that are conducted through the Decree N° 1023/2001 the Decree N° 1030/2016.
- Procurements conducted as "Government-to-Government" contracts, including those financed by public institutions, are not covered by those Decrees, and therefore are excluded.
- Offsets are required in all foreign acquisitions with a contract price equivalent or higher than 240.000 modules. The value of the module is established by the Decree N° 1030/2016 and currently is 8.000 argentine pesos (see link below).
- Therefore, the current threshold for demanding an offset agreement is equivalent to 1.920.000.000 argentine pesos.
- The supplier of the foreign goods will have to subscribe to a "Productive Cooperation
 Agreements", involving the local sub-contracting of goods and/or services for an amount of
 at least 20% of the contract price.
- In case this is not possible, the requirement can be fulfilled through a technology transfer, a
 foreign direct investment or an investment in local R&D.



Defense Offset Policy Guidelines

Statement of objectives

As it was stated previously, Government-to-Government acquisitions, including those financed by public institutions, are not conducted through the National Procurement regulations. Therefore, they are not compelled to demand an offset agreement.

Therefore, a specific offset policy guideline is establish for G-to-G acquisitions of the Ministry of Defense, through Ministerial Resolution N° 1612/2022.

Defense offsets are expected to fulfill the following industrial policy objectives:

- Provide demand flow from foreign acquisitions to the local industry.
- Increase scientific, technological and industrial defense related capabilities.
- Integrate the local industry to defense global value chains.

Conditions of Application

The Guidelines apply to all G-to-G acquisitions by the Ministry of Defense, the Armed Forces, the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and their decentralized organisms.

Offsets are required in all foreign acquisitions with a contract price equivalent or higher than 240.000 modules. The value of the module is established by the Decree N° 1030/2016 and currently is 8.000 argentine pesos (see Link below).

Therefore, the current threshold for demanding a defense offset agreement is equivalent to 1.920.000.000 argentine pesos.

Definition

The supplier of the foreign goods or services shall have to subscribe to "Productive Cooperation Agreements" or "offset", for an equivalent to 100% of the contract price, expressed in offset credit value.

Possible defense offset agreements are the following:

- Local sub-contracting.
- Co-production.
- Production under license.
- Exports.
- Foreign investment.
- Technology transfers.

Beneficiaries

Defense offset agreements shall have as possible beneficiaries one or more of the following entities belonging to the DEFENSE INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL COMPLEX (DITC):

- The Defense Industrial Base (DIB): local public and private companies that supply defense related goods and services (excluding office equipment or supplies).
- The scientific research institutes of the Ministry of Defense: Institute of Scientific and Technical Research for Defense (CITEDEF), the National Meteorological Service, the National Hydrographical Service and the National Geographical Service.
- The Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Argentine Army, the Argentine Navy and the Argentine Air Force.
